

Environmental Health Specialist Advanced Training on On-site Sewage Management Systems

COURSE DESCRIPTION AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this eight-hour training class is to increase the knowledge of those county board of health employees whose job responsibilities include the evaluation, inspection and permitting of onsite sewage management systems for residential and commercial establishments. This class will satisfy the eight hours of continuing education requirement for their bi-annual GA DPH Certification renewal.

By the end of the On-site Sewage Management Systems training, participants will be able to:

- Better understand the processes involved in performing subdivision plan reviews
- Evaluate which alternative on-site sewage management systems are better suited for marginal soils
- Troubleshoot failing on-site sewage management systems and determine the appropriate repair option
- Properly record the causes for on-site system failures
