COURSE DESCRIPTION AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The Georgia Department of Public Health, Environmental Health Section will be providing this four hour training to Environmental Health professionals with responsibilities in permitting and inspecting Mobile Food Service Units. Participants will be able to engage in lectures, small group activities, and a table top exercise to heighten their knowledge of the necessary requirements to permit and inspect Mobile Food Units.

- Better evaluate a Mobile Food Unit's operational methods
- Examine a Mobile Food Unit's plan review documents in conjunction with its proposed menu to determine the unit's capabilities for operation
- Explain why collaboration efforts between counties is vital for permitting and inspecting Mobile Food Units
- Properly complete the inspection report forms
