Tort Reform Passes Senate – Heads to the House

A divided Georgia Senate passed a comprehensive tort reform bill Friday that is Governor Kemp's top priority for the 2025 General Assembly session. Senate Bill 68, which the Senate passed 33-21 along party lines, is aimed at reining in huge jury awards in civil lawsuits.

The bill contains a number of provisions, including:

- Prohibiting plaintiff lawyers in a civil lawsuit from asking a jury for a specific amount of damages until closing arguments.
- Requiring judges to rule on motions to dismiss a case filed by defense lawyers before the start of what tends to be an expensive discovery process.
- Prohibiting plaintiff lawyers from filing motions to dismiss a case and refiling a lawsuit after the jury has been seated and opening statements have taken place. Refiling at such a late stage forces defendants to spend money unnecessarily.
- Prohibits lawyers for either side from seeking double recoveries of attorney fees from the other side.
- Allows defense lawyers to introduce into evidence whether a plaintiff injured in an auto accident was wearing a seat belt.
- Establishes "premises liability" guidelines for when plaintiffs can sue business owners for negligence due to injuries suffered from criminal acts committed by a third party outside of the defendant's control.
- Allows plaintiffs to seek economic damages based only on the actual costs of the medical care they receive.
- Requires liability in a civil suit to be determined before the jury considers damages if either the plaintiff or defendant requests such "bifurcation" of trials.

Senators unanimously passed an amendment submitted on the floor that would allow deliberating juries to ask the judge whether a plaintiff has health insurance, the amount of the injured party's medical bill, and how much of the claim the insurance company paid.

Hurricane Helene Relief

Tax relief bills targeting victims of Hurricane Helene cleared both chambers of the General Assembly this week. The House unanimously passed legislation exempting from taxation disaster relief payments, grant funds, or crop insurance proceeds provided to victims of the massive storm that struck south, middle, and eastern Georgia last September.

"This storm was bad. It looked like a tornado hit everywhere," House Majority Whip James Burchett, R-Waycross, chief sponsor of HB 223, said. "It's going to take years to recover." The bill, which passed 173-0, now pending in the Senate Finance Committee, includes \$200 million in income tax credits for timber producers who suffered losses from the hurricane and a sales tax exemption on purchases of building materials used to repair or replace greenhouses, poultry sheds, or livestock barns that lay in the storm's path. Hatchett, who chairs the House Appropriations Committee, said Tuesday's measure is one of a series of bills to be taken up during this legislative session that will offer state assistance to Georgians affected by Helene.

Along those lines, the Senate also unanimously passed legislation aimed specifically at timber producers. SB 52, now pending in the House Ways & Means Committee, would temporarily exclude from taxation timber sold or harvested from timberland in Georgia counties declared federal disaster areas after the hurricane. Sen. Russ Goodman, R-Cogdell, the bill's chief sponsor, said 37% of the state's 22 million acres of timberland was damaged or destroyed during the storm. The tax exemption would cover the fourth quarter of last year and all of this year, Goodman said. "No one is ever going to be made whole from this," he said. "It's just our job to do what we can within the power we have to help our fellow Georgians." SB 52 now moves to the House.

Next Week

The legislature will be in session Monday for day 22, in recess Tuesday for a committee work day and in session Wednesday through Friday, which will complete 25 days of the 40-day session.

The Senate Appropriations Committee is scheduled to meet Monday morning to vote out the Amended FY 2025 budget. The Senate is expected to adopt it midweek.

HB 322, Ga. Board of Dentistry (Rep. Lee Hawkins – R)

So as to revise provisions regarding the Georgia Board of Dentistry issuance of a dental or dental hygiene license for the sole purpose of teaching or instructing in an accredited dental school, dental hygiene school, or academic medical center in this state. **Status:** Referred to Health Cmte, Passed Cmte by Substitute, Pending Rules Cmte

<u>HB 352</u>, Georgia Gestational Diabetes Management Act; enact (Rep. Devan Seabaugh – R) So as to revise coverage criteria to include Medicaid recipients with gestational diabetes. **Status:** Referred to Public Community and Health Cmte, Passed by Substitute, Pending Rules Cmte

<u>HB 117</u>, Food service establishments (Rep. Jesse Petrea – R)

So as to require notification of the country of origin of seafood items **Status:** Referred to Agriculture & Consumer Affairs Cmte, Passed Cmte by Substitute, Pending Rules Cmte, Passed House, Sent to Senate, Referred to Interstate Cooperation

<u>HB 440</u>, Providing Effective Access to Cannabis for Health (PEACH) Act (Rep. David Clark – R) So as to rename low THC oil as medical cannabis; Relating to offenses against the public health and morals, regulation of controlled substances, and general provisions relative to the Department of Public Health. **Status:** Referred to Health Cmte

HB 112, Income tax; One-time Tax Rebate (Rep. Lauren McDonald III – R)
